



## 2025 CBMP Midstream Essay Contest Winners Named

Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi's Coastal Bend Midstream program (CBMP) and Howard Energy Partners (HEP) are pleased to announce the winners of the inaugural CBMP Midstream Essay Contest. The essay assignment, titled "*The Future of the Midstream Industry*", was open to all undergraduate and graduate students at all four-year public universities in Texas. The essay competition primarily sought the perspectives from students enrolled in degree programs in the colleges of Business, Engineering, and Arts & Sciences, but students from all disciplines were encouraged to submit essays. Topics were wide-ranging and included, but were not limited to, corporate finance and structure, capital markets, engineering, operations, regulation, legal matters, and human capital.

Generally, the midstream industry gathers, processes, fractionates, transports via pipelines, and stores oil, natural gas, natural gas liquids (NGLs), and NGL fractionated products such as propane, ethane, and butane. The industry ultimately collects raw hydrocarbons from oil and gas fields (upstream) and delivers them to consumers, including refiners, petrochemical plants, heavy industry, and retail and residential consumers (downstream). The broad range of eligible degree programs and essay topics was designed not only to expose students across many degree programs and interests to the midstream industry, but also to identify and highlight unique perspectives from tomorrow's leaders.
