A NOTE FROM THE DRAMATURG

On one hand, *Be More Chill* has a backstory that is only possible in the 21st Century. After a poorly received world premiere at a small regional theatre in New Jersey in 2015, this little show with Book by Joe Tracz and Score by Joe Iconis seemed destined to be forgotten. However, when a cast recording of the songs was released online, it soon racked up more than 100 million streams. After finding the songs via streaming outlets, devotees from around the globe gathered on platforms such as YouTube and Tumblr, forming what was at the time the 2nd-biggest musical theatre online fandom in the world --- behind only *Hamilton*. And they weren't just passive consumers; they were active creators: fan art, animatics, cosplay performances. All this activity attracted the attention of commercial producers, and this little show was propelled to off-Broadway and, in 2019, Broadway.

But in many ways, the origin of this show is just like dozens of others that came before it: *Les Misérables, Showboat, Cabaret,* and many others all started life as novels. In 2004, 23-year-old writer Ned Vizzini published his first novel: *Be More Chill.* It tells the story of a high

school student who has a computer implanted in his brain that tells him how to be popular. This brief summary might sound silly, but like most science fiction, it contains a strong thread of social satire: the codes and signs of "coolness" reveal themselves to be astonishingly easy to manipulate. We see how far people will go in order to fit in. Plus, it is remarkable how eerily prescient this 20year-old book is about Artificial Intelligence.



The book also falls under the label Young Adult

Literature, or YA Lit. This is a broad term, covering hundreds of different titles of all different genres, from *The Hunger Games* to *The Hate U Give*. While topics like peer pressure and high school cliques are certainly a part of YA Lit, so are any number of powerful themes that depict real teens' concerns. Vizzini's most famous novel is *It's Kind of a Funny Story* (later turned into a movie), which depicts a teenager's hospitalization for depression and suicidal ideation. It was a fictionalized version of his own experience. Sadly, his struggles never really ended, and he died by suicide in 2013 at the age of 32. He left behind a body of work in which young adults have seen themselves ever since.
