General Information

The University of Corpus Christi, founded in 1947, is a senior, coeducational liberal arts and technological college affiliated with the Baptist General Convention of Texas.

Work done at the University is accredited by the Texas Association of Colleges, the Texas Association of Music Schools and the Texas Education Agency. The University is approved by the Veterans Administration for training of Korean War veterans.

UCC has an outstanding faculty. Seventeen faculty members have earned doctoral degrees, 18 have masters degrees and four hold bachelor degrees. The University's percentage of doctorates (43.58%) is 10.58 percentage points above the national average. Each faculty member teaches in his or her special field. Classes are small and students receive the additional benefit of individual attention.

Enrollment is approximately 600. Although UCC is a Baptist college, its doors are open to students of all faiths. Twenty-one religious groups are represented in the student body.


The University is located on a 233-acre campus overlooking beautiful Corpus Christi Bay at the southern tip of a metropolis of 180,000 population. Corpus Christi offers many cultural and entertainment advantages to University students.

UCC is in the midst of a \$13 million permanent campus development program with four brick buildings completed and 17 more scheduled for construction in the next 10 years.


How To Enroll

High School Graduates — Students should complete an application form, furnished by the registrar, and return it for the University's approval. Graduates of affiliated high schools who have never attended college should enclose a transcript of high school work with the application for admission. Students are notified of their acceptance by the registrar's office.

Transfers — Students desiring to transfer to the University from another college must present a transcript of work done in the college or colleges attended. A statement of honorable dismissal must accompany the transcript. The grade of D does not transfer. All transfer work will be evaluated and approved in terms of work done in the University.

For students with good credit ratings, the University of Corpus Christi provides a monthly payment plan. At the beginning of each semester, the total semester's expense is divided by four. A down payment of one-fourth is due and payable at registration and the balance is payable in three equal monthly installments. A \$5 per semester service charge applies on all installment accounts. Books cannot be purchased on this plan.

Scholarship and Loan Funds

The University offers honor scholarships to the highest-ranking boy and girl in the graduating classes of affiliated high schools. The scholarships must be accepted the same year of graduation from high school.

Ministerial tuition aid is allocated by the Baptist General Convention of Texas for qualified ministerial students.

Eighteen loan funds are available to worthy students. Applications for loans should be made through the business office of the University.


The University of Corpus Christi also participates in the National Defense Education Act. Under Title II of this program, the University is authorized to make federally-supported loans to worthy, full-time students with superior academic background. Preference will be given to students intending to teach in elementary or secondary schools, or whose background indicates superior capacity or preparation in engineering, science or mathematics.

Employment Service


The University operates a student employment service which has been highly successful in securing part-time work for students. Some opportunities for employment are available on the campus. The University's location in metropolitan Corpus Christi makes it possible for other students to find positions in a wide variety of business and industrial firms. No charge is made for student use of the employment service. Prospective students interested in seeking employment are invited to write the University for an application.

Housing Facilities

The University maintains excellent housing for both single and married students. Single men live in W. A. Miller Hall and single

Veterans — Veterans of the Korean War may enter the University under the GI Bill of Rights. To secure the benefits under Public Law 550 a veteran must secure a certificate of eligibility from the Veterans Administration.

REQUIRED UNITS — At least fifteen affiliated high school units or the equivalent must be submitted to satisfy entrance requirements. The fifteen must include: English, 3 or 4 units; social science, 2 units; foreign language or natural science, 2 units; mathematics, 2 units; and six elective units. Not more than four units may be presented in vocational subjects.

Degrees Offered

The University offers three degrees — Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science and Bachelor of Music. The Bachelor of Arts degree is offered with a major in biology, chemistry, English, history, mathematics, religion, Spanish and speech. The Bachelor of Science degree is offered with majors in general science, education, accounting, business administration, physical education, and special education. The Bachelor of Music degree is offered with majors in music education, piano or voice.


Pre-Professional Study

The University offers many courses required by professional schools as basic training. It usually takes three years to complete these courses. Students interested in civil, mechanical, and electrical engineering, medicine, nursing, dentistry and law can receive pre-professional training at UCC.

Expenses

Cost of attending the University is comparable to that of other major institutions of higher learning. Students are offered a quality education at the lowest possible cost.

The average student will encounter these expenses. Tuition is \$12 a semester hour or \$180 a semester for the normal college schedule of fifteen hours. Board is \$200 a semester and room rent is \$80 a semester. There are no general fees, however, students may have laboratory fees in some special courses. Total expense of room, board and tuition for an academic year is \$920.

women in Gazzie Warren Hall. Both are two-story, brick structures with the most modern facilities available. Two students are accommodated in each dormitory room.

Unfurnished efficiency units and two and three-bedroom apartments are available for married students with families.

For room or apartment reservations, write the business office. A \$10 deposit is required to hold a reservation. Apartment rentals vary from \$37.50 a month to \$57.50 a month, with utilities paid.

Extracurricular Activities

The University of Corpus Christi believes that sound extra-curricular activities add much to a student's college days. Twenty-five academic, social, cultural and religious organizations on the campus provide an outlet for a wide variety of extra-curricular interests.

UCC's band, choir and Choraliers make frequent concert, radio and television appearances throughout South Texas. Talented students are encouraged to become members of these organizations. Scholarships are available in varying amounts for qualifying members of the Choraliers and the band.

In addition to a full program of campus activities, students participate in the Corpus Christi Little Theatre, the Symphony, Fine Arts Colony and other civic and cultural groups.

Sports


The University competes with other Texas colleges in an independent schedule in football, basketball, boxing, swimming and baseball. Athletics is considered an important part of University life, but is not emphasized to the detriment of studies. There is also an intramural athletic program for both men and women students.

Health Services

The University maintains a well-equipped dispensary with a registered nurse in charge. In addition the services of a competent physician are available. The health program includes a physical examination of each student enrolling in the University for the first time.
