Last chance to apply for newspaper jobs

There are several paid, part-time positions available on the staff of the *Island Waves*. Over a dozen applications have been received, are being reviewed and the interviews will begin soon.

If you have journalism experience or other skills needed to produce

the student newspaper, and the desire and time to get involved, then you should come by the Island Waves office in room 205 of the Student Services Center (round building).

There are jobs for reporters, advertising sales, and editor. The jobs are budgeted for 10–20 hours a week, depending on the position, and the pay rate is about minimum wage. All positions require some computer literacy; however, the editor's job requires a person skilled in desktop publishing and page layout in addition to having a good journalism background. All the jobs will likely entail more work than the budget will pay for, especially the editor, but persons applying for these jobs should have a stronger desire for putting out a student newspaper than their desire for a good-paying job. Hey, the campus needs a student paper and without a journalism department we're lucky to have the University support we've got. What we need most is the support of the students.

Volunteer positions are also available to help with the newspaper. There are a variety of interests on the campus and we need people to let us know what is going on so that the student body can be kept informed. Newspaper staff meetings are held at noon on Wednesdays in SSC 205; interested students should attend.
