

still is not known.
Yet officials maintain that the building is a bargain and could not be duplicated for anywhere near the \$300,000 figure under normal circumstances. Mrs. Butt, who worked closely with the planphases of construction, said many of the suppliers granted conces sions on materials and contracts because they were personally interested in the building. 
