REPORT SUMMARY

The 2016 *Undergraduate Student Survey* (USS) was administered to sophomores and juniors in April 2016. The USS is a complementary survey to the *Graduating Student Survey* (GSS) and was first administered in 2015. This survey report includes the questions' ratings from last year.

Two questions on this survey also appear on the GSS. They are:

1. If you were to start all over again, would you attend TAMU-CC?
2. Would you recommend TAMU-CC to a prospective student?

Demographics

A total of 4,023 students were invited to take the survey. A total of 898 students opened the survey, but only 720 students answered at least one question and are considered respondents, for a response rate of 18%. Male students are underrepresented in the respondent population. More than twice as many females as males responded to the survey

KEY FINDINGS

Campus Experiences

The items receiving the **highest** ratings of combined satisfaction (*Very Satisfied* responses added with the *Satisfied* responses) in campus experiences are as follows:

- The ease of dropping/adding courses (94%)
- The safety of recreational sports facilities (99%)
- The cleanliness of recreational sports facilities and equipment (98%)
- The overall condition of University grounds and landscaping (97%)
- The overall safety of the campus (95%)
- The helpfulness of the staff at the mail center (95%)
- The ability to find materials in the library to complete class assignments (95%)

The items receiving the **lowest** ratings of satisfaction in general experiences, under the recommended 75%, are as follows:

- The quality of the food in the Dining Hall (69% -up 9% from last year)
- The availability of channels for expressing student complaints (72% -an 8% improvement)

Campus Offices

Generally, 90% of students are satisfied with campus offices. All campus offices listed below received a combined satisfaction score over 90% for Courtesy and 89% or higher for Helpfulness.

Campus Services

The following campus services received a combined satisfaction score of 90% or more.

- SAIL Online Portal (94%)
- Bell Library (96%)
- CASA (tutoring) (90%)
- Disability Services (97%)
- Counseling Center (94%)
- Health Center (90%)
- University Center (98%)
- Recreational Sports Facilities (96%)

Campus Copies scored 86%, a 1% improvement over last year's score. While Campus Dining Options had the lowest satisfaction score, 73%, their score was 14% higher than last year. Last year many students were very dissatisfied because of no dining options in the University Center (UC) as it was closed for renovation. Still, over a quarter of the students are not satisfied with the dining options.

Noteworthy items

- Many students noted that classes in their major were closed when they went to register (91 marked "always" and 159 marked "often" a total of 38%). Another 267 students (41%) said they were closed "sometimes".
- *The contribution of intercollegiate athletic programs to your sense of school spirit*, increased from 76% to 84%.
- The availability of channels for expressing student complaints markedly increased from 64% in 2015 to 72% this year.
- The contribution of intercollegiate athletic programs to your sense of school spirit increased 8% from 76% in 2015 to 84% this year.
- Over 90% of students are satisfied with the bus service to campus: Route 5 (94%), Momentum shuttle (92%), Route 37 (91%), and the Wave #63 (90%).
- The satisfaction with the web registration process decreased to 84% from 90% in 2015.

About the response numbers:

Respondents did not necessarily answer all questions on the survey. Therefore, the total number of responses for a question will not necessarily match other questions.

About percentages:

Valid percent means the percentage based on the number of people who answered the question, not the percentage of all the people who answered any question. Percentages are rounded to the nearest whole number, except when less than 1% in which case the exact percentage is reported.
