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2014 BCSSE Executive Summary

The Beginning College Survey of Student Engagement (BCSSE) collects data from college students around the country about their high school academic and co-curricular experiences in addition to their expectations for the first year of college. The BCSSE is designed to be paired with the NSSE administration at the end of the students' first year, so that comparisons can be made between expectations and actual experiences.


Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi first-year students have participated every two years since 2008. The 2014 survey was administered in First-Year Seminar (UCCP) courses from August 27th until September 12th. There were 1,250 surveys distributed to freshmen in their courses. Although 85% were completed (**n**= 1,059) overall, some students chose to skip some of the questions.


Interesting Quick Facts~


- 98% of the students are full time
- For 87% Texas A&M-Corpus Christi is one of their top two college choices
- 44% said it will be fairly or very difficult to pay college expenses this year
- 34% have three or more close friends attending this college
- 62% live within walking distance to campus
- 29% are less than an hour from home
- For 65% home is more than 100 miles from Texas A&M-Corpus Christi
- A large increase in the proportion of females, 63% this year compared to 57% in 2012
- The intended major with the highest number of students is the Health Professions at 34% of the new students. The next highest number of students (20%) plans to major in Biological Sciences, Agriculture, & Natural Resources. Twelve percent intend to major in Business. All other intended majors are less than 10% of the population.
- During their high school years, these are the extracurricular activities students participated in the most: Community Service- 74%; Athletics teams- 70%; Academic clubs or honor societies- 50%; Performing or Visual Arts- 49%; Religious Youth Groups- 35%


2014 BCSSE Results

There are a couple of significant changes in our freshmen population from the 2012 BCSSE. First, there is a large increase in the proportion of females, and a corresponding drop in the proportion of males.















This chart represents the percentage of students whose home is the following distance in travel time from Texas A&M-Corpus Christi.




Students were asked: What were most of your high school grades?



Females had much higher high school grades than males. Also, no female had less than C+.







First generation status:

For the BCSSE, 34% of the students indicated at least one parent has a 4-year college degree meaning these students are not considered first generation. This definition differs somewhat from other surveys and the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board definition which defines a student as not first generation if either parent/guardian has a two-year degree or higher. Under the THECB definition, 44% of this group of students are not first generation and 56% are first generation. For the BCSSE survey, 66% of the freshmen are first generation.


Grades by first generation, or not first generation.














