Tech Tips

Benefits to Drysuit Diving





There are numerous reasons why a drysuit is part of a scientific divers' plethora of equipment. Drysuits provide thermal and exposure protection by keeping the cold water from contacting most of the diver's skin. The ability of a diver to remain in cold water longer is greatly increased when using a drysuit. Semi-drysuits are a great alternative to the more expensive drysuit, but the body is still directly exposed to cold water which decreases the overall temperature and time that the diver can remain in the water. With proper storage and maintenance, the life of a drysuit far exceeds the life of a wetsuit. Always remember to lubricate seals and zippers after use and before storing your drysuit. If you are interested in drysuit diving, sign up for the Dry Suit course on February 9!
