- **1. Guest Speaker(s):** *Ms. Alexa Hight,* Scholarly Communications Librarian, *Texas A&M University- Corpus Christi, (20-minute presentation, 10-minute Q/A).* 
  - Ms. Hight gave a presentation about publishing in high impact journals and how to increase research visibility. Her presentation was sent to the Council after the meeting.
    - a. Presentation included:
      - i. Journal Impact Factor
        - 1. Impact Factor takes into consideration the size of the journal and number of papers published.
        - 2. Discussion about pitfalls the Impact Factor and how researchers are being evaluated by citations and impact.
      - ii. Increasing Visibility
        - 1. Social media- having your work available online is essential.
        - 2. Assess and improve your online presence.
        - 3. Make a digital footprint.
        - 4. Grow your networks.
        - 5. ORCID- this program helps increase your online presence and maintains your researcher identity.
          - a. Interfolio will talk to ORCID.
      - iii. Increasing Citations
        - 1. Make your work as open as possible.
      - iv. Article Levels
        - 1. Gold: Paying to make your work open.
        - 2. Green: Open access that is free.
        - 3. Bronze: COVID comes to play with this. All articles COVID related are open.
      - v. Retaining your Copyright
        - 1. Helps control your works and makes it visible.
      - vi. Open Access
        - 1. Important because it is open and accessible to all social justices. Open access if broad and global.

- vii. Library Resources
  - 1. Library can help with author level metrics, H-index, i10-index, etc.
  - 2. Library can help you determine your online presence.
- viii. VIVO
- Library is exploring this record keeping database for purchase.
  Ouestion(s)/Suggestion(s)/Comment(s):
  - i. Suggestion: asked the library to look into Microsoft Co-Pilot.
    - ii. Comment: Most faculty do not have networks of people, in particular PhD students, working with them to cite their work. Students help with the number of citations faculty/researchers get.
      - 1. Paying for Research Gate does not help with increasing citations.
    - iii. Comment: The programs, ChatGPT and ChatGPT4, have limitations and can't distinguish sources. Use caution and they should not be used to do literature reviews.
    - iv. Question: Does VIVO populate automatically?
      - 1. A: Yes, you can curate it to select which articles/information you want public or private.
    - v. Question: Will the library provide/find outlets for student to publish their research?
      - 1. A: Will get back to you.

  - Discussion about business faculty in College Station that are excluded to serve on CPIRA because they can't make the in-person meetings.
  - MOTION: Continue discussion to have hybrid CPIRA Council meetings.
    All in Favor-Yes
  - Concerns:
    - CPIRA needs full participation and face to face helps with this.
    - Difficult for coordinator to take notes and run online chat.
    - Head count for food will be needed way in advance of meeting.
    - Lonestar recently remodeled their conference room and offered it as an option for CPIRA to meet.
