What is JAMP?

The Joint Admission Medical Program (JAMP) is a program designed by the Texas legislature to help talented, economically-disadvantaged students achieve their dream of becoming a doctor.

Program participants receive:



Exclusive **academic and clinical training opportunities** through JAMP summer internships



Comprehensive, multi-phase **MCAT preparation** program



Dedicated **mentoring**



Financial support through undergraduate and medical school scholarships



Guaranteed admission to a participating Texas medical school if all criteria are met

What qualifications are required to apply to JAMP?

To be eligible to participate in the program, the following should apply to you (at the time the application is submitted in October):

- ✓ Starting your second-year (Regular Admission track) or first-year (Early Admission track) of college
- ✓ Enrolled in college in the fall semester immediately following high school graduation
- ✓ Completed 27 college credit hours (including General Chem I and II)
- ✓ Minimum 3.25 GPA and 3.25 science GPA
- ✓ Financial-aid eligible (with a FAFSA EFC of <\$8000)
- ✓ Texas Resident and U.S. Citizen or Permanent Resident
- ✓ 100% committed to pursuing a medical degree in Texas
